Williams Syndrome is rare. If there are 30 children in each class – we would expect just 1 class out of 600 classes to have a child with Williams Syndrome in it.



Children with Williams Syndrome usually:

- have a heart condition
- have more medical appointments
- find learning more difficult
- need extra help in class
- find PE tricky
- find writing and fastening buttons / laces tricky
- 🧡 have sensitive ears and can find loud noises upsetting
- ask lots of questions if they are worried about something
- worry if someone is sad
